


TRENDS IN MBTA RIDERSHIP

Unlinked trips have increased since the 1990s




THE PEAK OF THE CAR?

People are waiting longer to get a driver's license, but will overall car ownership and miles driven decrease long term?




TELECOMMUTING IS BECOMING MORE COMMON

As technology continues to advance, more workers are commuting less to physical offices, and working more from their homes.




BIKING IS INCREASING
